



WHAT IS THE JUBILEE YEAR?

Since 1300 AD, the Catholic Church has periodically celebrated a Jubilee year – an entire year of particular grace and opportunity to grow in holiness. This practice is very scriptural, and derives from the Old Testament Jubilee year that God commanded His people to keep, after liberating them from slavery in Egypt and establishing them in the Promised Land. The Church presently celebrates a Jubilee every 25 years. Our current Jubilee year began on Christmas Eve, and will end on January 6, 2026.

When God delivered the Israelites from Egypt, in what we call the Exodus, it was necessary to reestablish them in their identity as His people. Centuries of oppression and close association with paganism had led to confusion about who God is, and the relationship He desires with us. Many of the Old Testament laws are based on safeguarding that identity, so that the people of God would not forget that they were the chosen people, set apart from all the other nations in order to draw the nations into relationship with the only God.

One of these prescriptions was the observance of the Jubilee year. Just as there was a sabbath day every seven days, there was a sabbath year every seven years; and after seven cycles of sabbath years, there would be a Jubilee. In the Jubilee year, relationships between the people would be restored, debts would be forgiven, and land that was sold due to economic hardship would be returned. In a sense, the Jubilee year was instituted to make sure that God's people never fell again into slavery, with a particular emphasis on freedom from economic bondage.

Of course, even the greatest amount of financial freedom means little in comparison with the freedom from sin, despair, and slavery to the devil that Christ came to offer us. At the beginning of His public ministry (see Luke 4), Jesus announced His mission by declaring that He is, Himself, the fulfilment of Isaiah's prophesy concerning the Jubilee (see Isaiah 61): "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good tidings to the afflicted; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor..."

The "year of the Lord's favor" is a reference to the year of Jubilee. It is the freedom that comes to us through the mercy of God in Jesus Christ that the Church invites us to joyfully and generously celebrate this year.

There are many different emphases that Pope Francis has set forth for our meditation and our action. The theme of this Jubilee is "Pilgrims of Hope," and so we are offered the opportunity to reflect deeply on the hope we have in Christ. Our ability to confidently trust in God's power and desire to help, sustain, and save us is so important to God that He pours it into our souls through the theological virtue of hope! By reminding ourselves of God's goodness and faithfulness, we can foster hope in our own hearts, and strengthen it in those around us.

In every Jubilee year, pilgrimage and indulgences are both highlighted. There are many Jubilee pilgrimage sites, especially in Rome; however, the three pilgrimage sites in our archdiocese are the cathedral in Cincinnati, Emmanuel Church in Dayton, and the Maria Stein Shrine of the Holy Relics. A plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions, is attached to visiting one of these sites to participate in prayer, devotional practices, and the liturgy. Mary, Queen of Angels will be organizing a family-wide pilgrimage to Maria Stein this fall – stay tuned for more details!

There is also an emphasis this year on performing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, to which there is a Jubilee indulgence attached. We also hope to offer special opportunities for our family of parishes to come together in acts of service.

Nowhere is the freedom of Christ effected in our souls more powerfully than in the sacraments. Pope Francis has encouraged us to be sure that we meet God's mercy in Confession. We pray that the favor of the Lord, poured abundantly on His people in this year of Jubilee, will lead all members of Mary, Queen of Angels to receive this sacrament, and be filled with hope and joy.

Many resources are available to help us learn about and engage deeply in the Jubilee. Recordings of Fr. Kohn's homily (labeled "Know the Scriptures, Know Christ"), and Fr. Landenwitch's (labeled #436 - "A Year Acceptable to the Lord") from the third Sunday in Ordinary Time are both available at queenofangelsfamily.com. The Jubilee has its own website (iubilaeum2025.va). The Archdiocese of Cincinnati has information on its website, as well (catholicaoc.org). Finally, scripture scholar Dr. John Bergsma, is an expert on the Jubilee, and has both written a book, and provided many videos which are easily searchable online.

It is the year of the Lord's favor! May each of us in Mary, Queen of Angels open our hearts to the hope, the mercy, and the freedom God longs to give us, and move us to share the blessings of this year of Jubilee with everyone we meet.
